

Anleitung: USB 3.0 Mojave / (High-) Sierra / El Capitan für jedermann (zukunftsicher für Updates & komplett gepatcht)

Well you just copy the DSDT.aml to EFI/OZ/APCI/Load via Finder. If you have a SSDT.aml, just leave it in the same folder. You could also add the SSDT to you DSDT but thats not necessary. If something goes wrong with the next boot up you can just rename or remove the DSDT via the shell. Do you have the built in shell in your BIOS, available in the boot menu? When you start it you should see a black screen with yellow text. Then you're at the right spot. By typing fs0: and afterwards navigating to the right folder via "ls" (show files) and "cd" (change directory) you should be able to find your DSDT. Then remove it with the command "rm DSDT.aml"

Afterwards you should be fine again 😊
