Because everyone claims you should pick your SMBIOS solely based on the CPU, which despite being common sense in the Hackintosh scene **is wrong**. It really depends on your hardware. While in most cases it indeed is true that picking by CPU type is your best bet, there are cases like the Vega 56 and 64 where the graphics hardware matters more. The reason for that is the specific configuration of the AppleGVA and AppleVPA frameworks.

Using the iMacPro18,3 SMBIOS with a Vega 56 or 64 causes the following issues:

- Need for IGPU (Quick Sync) in order to have preview working properly without Kext Hacks
- Slower Encoding performance due to mainly the IGPU being used
- Non-working DRM

You can fix some of that by disabling IGPU and editing the configuration of aforementioned frameworks, but that's just a dirty workaround.

The most clean solution is using the iMac Pro SMBIOS where every configuration hard-coded by apple matches your GPU, eliminating all issues at once without any dirty workarounds.
